### Principal held for sexual harassment

BANGALORE: A UK national and principal of a prestigious international school at Sahakarnagar was on Saturday arrested under the Juvenile Act and Information Technology Act for allegedly sexually harassing a 12-year-old male student.

Police said Paul Nekaan was staying alone in a flat in Kodigehalli, and during the last few months, he allegedly sent obscene messages to the boy on his cellphone and social networking site Facebook.

Neekan often summoned the boy to his chamber at school and asked him "highly inappropriate" questions. The boy's mother lodged a complaint with the school management and Neekan was dismissed thereafter, said DCP (North East) B R Ravikanthe Gowda.

Acting on a complaint filed on Friday, police arrested Neekan and produced him before a court, which granted him bail.

Bangalore: Paul Francis Meekan, the British headmaster of Trio World School in Kodigehalli in North Bangalore, was arrested on Saturday for allegedly sending vulgar messages through a social networking site to one of his boy students.

Deputy commissioner of police (north-east) R Ravikanthegowda told STOI the boy is a minor whose identity cannot be revealed as per law. The messages can be called 'dirty', he added, without elaborating on the offence.

The DCP said the accused has been remanded to judicial custody. A case under the Information Technology Act and Juvenile Act has been booked against him.

"The accused used to frequently call

my son to his chamber and talk about sex. He used to force my son to share his views on this subject. He posted sexual remarks on my son's social networking site account," the victim's parents said in a statement to the police.
